Novice Turner Project Turn a mushroom




Bring this to the June meeting

Ever popular, turned mushrooms come in many shapes and sizes. The idea here is to produce a pleasing ogee shape to approximately these dimensions.

Yew is a favourite timber for this item and if you can retain the bark so much the better. I didn't quite manage it this time

While you can turn a mushroom between centres a scroll chuck makes life a bit easier but it is a good idea to do the heavy cuts while the tailstock is engaged.

Shape the head with a spindle gouge. The underside of the mushroom head is undercut with a parting tool.. The stem was refined with a skew but the wing of a gouge would also serve.
